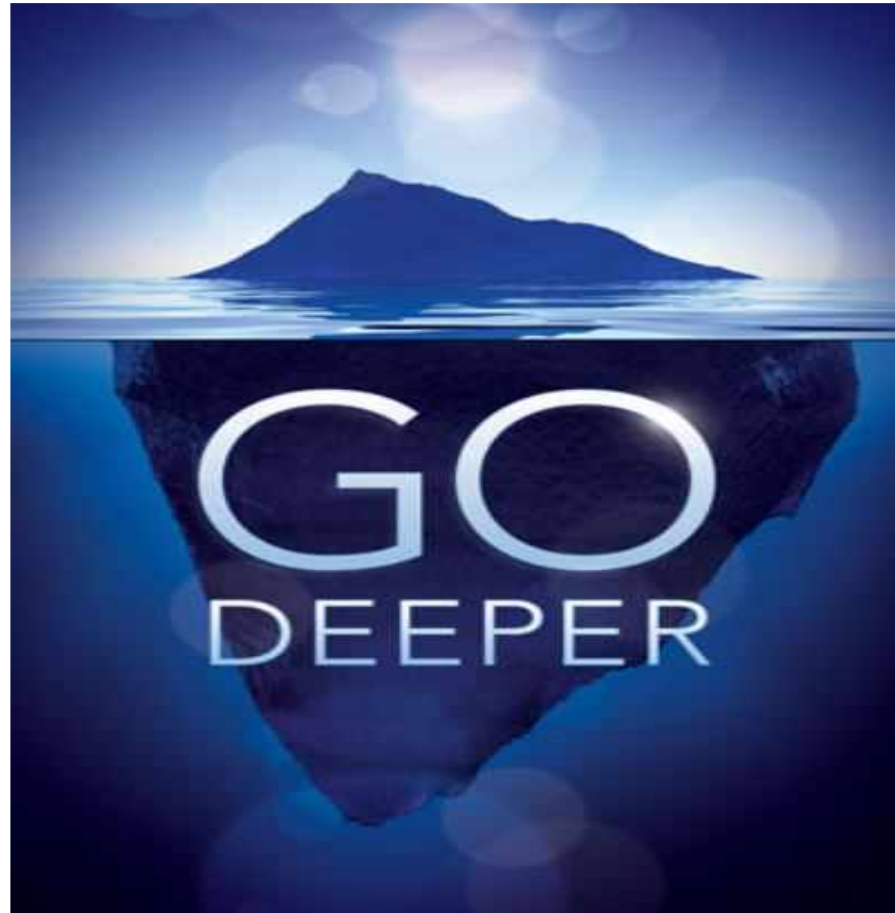

“One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God. He saw at the water’s edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, “Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch.” Simon answered, “Master, we’ve worked hard all night and haven’t caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets.”

When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink.

When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus’ knees and said, “Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!” For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon’s partners. “**Project Backpack**” is the August Mission Focus, and the need is greater than ever!! For 10 years our church has provided **50 backpacks** containing food and hygiene items once a month during the school year for 25 families at Mitchell High School and 25 at Swigert Middle School. Again this year, the need has escalated due to job loss and other pandemic-related set-backs.

\$160 covers the cost of one backpack (\$20) for 8 months. The total annual cost of providing 50 backpacks is \$8,000. A one-time contribution of any amount will help greatly, or you may pledge to give regularly in whatever amount and frequency is best for you.
